







All Financial Flows from Developed to Developing Nations, 1991-2009

- Expanded Knowledge and Demand through Technology




How the Developed World has Changed

- Partnerships across Sectors and Borders





Private Flows by Type, 1991-2009






ODA as a Percentage of GNI and in Billions, 2009








Comparing ODA and Total Assistance as a percentage of GNI, 2009






Total U.S. Economic Engagement with Developing Countries, 2009






Regional and Sectoral Breakdown Of 2009 U.S. Philanthropy: \$37.5 Billion






Incomplete Private giving Numbers Submitted to OECD and More Complete Numbers from CGP, 2009 (Billions \$)





All Financial Flows from Japan to Developing Countries, 2003-2010 (Billions of \$)






Impact of Private Flows on International Development and the MDGs
